What is the award?

"The Duke of Edinburgh's Award aims to provide for young people an enjoyable, challenging and rewarding programme of personal development"

It enables pupils to develop new skills, to work as both an individual and as a team to challenge themselves.

How is the scheme run at Eastwood?

- We believe that everyone should have the chance to achieve the award regardless of background, health, ability and wealth.
- All of year 9 will participate to gain valuable skills learnt in the classroom taught by experienced staff.
- Our resources and equipment for free
- We pay for the DofE account, insurance, registration, camp site fees and kit.
- We believe that all pupils can succeed with the right support.

DofE lessons at Eastwood

In lesson pupils will gain multiple skills such as:

- First aid including how to deal with cuts, sprains, burns, stings, broken bones. First hand experience at CPR on resuscitation dolls.
- Compass work including bearings.
- How to light and cook on trangias.
- How to put up tents
- Map reading 4 and 6 figure
- Planning and creating routes
- Drawing route plans
- Two group walks in the local area to practice skills


EXPEDITION

Select for three or six months

Evidence

- Pupils need to upload a photograph per week to evidence their activity.
- Pupils will be given assessor sheets which have to be completed each week
- At the end of the time period the assessor writes a statement in the bottom box.
- Assessors cannot by parents or siblings. They should be someone qualified/experienced to assess.
- Once the sheet is signed they upload it to their <u>DofE</u> account.

Expedition

 "To encourage a spirit of adventure and discovery by preparing for and carrying out an adventurous journey as part of a team."

Expedition

- You will complete practice walks in the local area during school time (2- 3 hrs)
- You will go on 1 weekend expedition. (May or June)
- Saturday you carry your kit, walk, put up your tent and cook then sleep in your tents with your group.
- Sunday you pack up site and walk again.
- Pupils carry all of their kit including food and drinks
- Medical dis-compensation some pupils may not be able to carry their full kit for medical reasons. We submit evidence to confirm this to the DofE.

Selection of groups

- X band or Y band
