## **E-Safety Information Sheet**

### **What is e-safety?**

Ofsted define it as a 'school's ability to protect and educate pupils and staff in their use of technology and to have the appropriate mechanisms to intervene and support any incident where appropriate'. In simple terms, e-safety is the 'safe and responsible use of technology'.

### **Where can my child find more information?**

The Academy's website has a page entitled 'E-Safety for Pupils' which can be accessed under the 'Pupils' section. The information provided covers links to the main risks and problems; and sources of support, advice and guidance.

### **Where can parents find more information?**

The information provided includes a link to the Academy's E-Safety Policy; a BCS accredited e-safety awareness course for parents; general advice on how to keep your child safe online; and links to a range of information and resources.

### **Where are your top tips for helping me keep my child safe online?**

Establish robust parent controls – prevention is better than a cure.

Establish clear rules for the use of technology to break the 24/7 culture and dependency.

Monitor (and be responsive to) changes in your child's character/personality and encourage them to talk to you about any of their concerns by offering reassurance and support.

Know where to get help if you are concerned about your child.
